Subject: CDBG Environmental Reviews

This month, HUD's Office of Environment and Energy (OEE) issued an e-mail confirming that it is HUD policy to <u>not</u> allow bids for choice-limiting actions (such as construction, demolition, etc.) before the environmental review is complete. HUD indicated that their policy is consistent with CEQ NEPA regulations at 40 CFR 1501.2 that require Agencies to "integrate the NEPA process with other planning at the earliest possible time to insure that planning and decisions reflect environmental values, to avoid delays later in the process, and to head off potential conflicts." The environmental review must be completed before bidding in order to allow for an unprejudiced decision about the action – and to allow for any modifications or project cancellation based upon the environmental review.

HUD indicated that they will update their website in the future to include some FAQs and/or guidance to address HUD's policies regarding what actions are prohibited before the environmental review is complete.
