It's April and that means Fair Housing Month! This year, we celebrate the 55th anniversary of the Fair Housing Act, the landmark civil rights law signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson on April 11, 1968, that made discrimination in housing transactions unlawful. The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in housing because of race, color, national origin, religion, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), disability, and familial status. The Act is intended to provide

for fair housing throughout the country. HUD has more information about fair housing on its FHEO webpage.

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## **SC CDBG & FAIR HOUSING**

The State of South Carolina undertakes fair housing planning at the state level and must certify each year that it will affirmatively further fair housing. Local governments, as a condition of receiving CDBG funds, must also certify to the State and to HUD that they will take proactive steps to affirmatively further fair housing. CDBG recipients do this by developing a fair housing plan and undertaking fair housing actions during each grant period.
